Berlin, December 1, N. S.

COUNT Poniatowsky having had Conferences with the Ministers, in which they gave him an Answer to the Representations he had made, the said Count took his Leave Yesterday of the King, and set out this Morning on his Return to Dantzick. The Advices we receive from Warlaw and Dantzick contradict one another so much, that little Dependance can be made on them concerning the Affairs of Poland. The Letters from the first Place and Petersbourg take no manner of Notice of the Irruption made by the Tartars into Ukraine: Those from Dantzick say, they have received there a Confirmation from three different Places of that Event; but as both Parties seem to agree that there was no Foundation for what has been published, of a Booty made by the new Regimentary of Lithuania, &c. we suspend our Belief here at present of the News concerning the Tartars, till it is confirmed from other Quarters.

Copenhagen, Dec. 1, N. S. Their Danish Majesties Birth-days (the Queen's on the 28th past, and the King's on the 30th,) were celebrated at Fridericksberg with Illuminations, Fireworks, and the usual Entertainments.

Hague, Dec. 8, N. S. The States of Holland put off their Assembly from Saturday last to the 17th Instant. The States have consented to the Instances of the Emperour, for borrowing two Millions of Florins of their Subjects upon the Revenues of Silesia, and it is said that the Loan is already filled up.

Paris, Dec. 9, N. S. It is said a Courier arrived at Versailles on the 7th Instant, with Letters of the 1st from the Camp before Pizzighitone, giving an Account, that M. de Boisieux, and a German Officer, who had been sent to Mantua to propose the Surrender of Pizzighitone, were returned, and brought Word, that it had been agreed to give up the Place to the French on the 8th Instant, N. S. if the same was not succoured before that Day; in which Case the Garrison, consisting of above 2500 Men, was to march out with all Marks of Honour, four Pieces of Cannon, and six covered Waggon, and was to be conducted to Mantua; where, when this Reinforcement arrives, there will be a Body of 10 or 11000 effective Men. There is likewise an Account of the Arrival of nine Spanish Battallions at Leghorn which failed lately from Alicant, but no Advice of the Departure of the grand Convoy from Barcelona.

Whitehall, Nov. 28, 1733.

Whereas on Monday the 5th of this Instant November, Christopher Best, one of the Peace Officers of the Hamlet of Mile-End Old-Town, in the Parish of Stepney, in the County of Middlesex, with Mather Davis, a Watchman, going their Rounds about Three of the

Clock in the Morning, were violently assaulted by Four Persons, (to whom they gave no Provocation) who cut the said Christopher Best over the Head in divers Places with a Hanger, and a Pistol being fired at the same Time, shot the said Mather Davis into the Head, of which Wound he died about Thirty Hours after: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Murder, is pleased to promise his most gracious Pardon to any one of them who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices, so as he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
