**C**OUNT Levold received the 24th Instant a Courier from his Court, which brought him Accounts of the Czarina's intending to augment her Army with 5000 Men, and of her being more and more determined to support the Election of King Augustus; and in Case the City of Dantzick persists in giving Refuge to King Stanislaus, or any of his Party, to send Vessels to bombard that Place.

Warsaw, Dec. 11. We have Advices of a Rencounter in Lithuania, between about Three Hundred Cossacks and a Party of M. Poccey's, which was more in Number; forty of the former are said to be killed, and eighty six of the latter. The Palatin of Novogrod has disposed the Palatinate of Bresz to accede to the Confederacy: In general it is said, that Things go well in Lithuania for the Confederates. The 9th Instant the Principal Confederates set out from hence with the Imperial and Russian Ministers; Six Hundred Russian Dragoons passed the Vistula from Praag in Boats the Day before; besides which, they were attended by two Regiments of Foot, with Eight or Ten Pieces of Cannon, and were met by Major General Wollinski two Miles off, with near 5000 Men; all which guard them as far as Lowitz, which is 12 Miles from hence; where, or near that Place, they expect to meet the Duke of Weissenfels with the Saxon Horse, and he is to conduct them to Taranowitz, which they will hardly reach till the End of the Month. A Courier is to be dispatched from Lowitz to King Augustus, to acquaint him with their being on the Road, and they hope he will be upon the Frontiers of Silesia as soon as they. 6000 Saxon Troops, under the Command of Lieutenant General Sulle, in the Absence of General Baudissin, which some time ago entered the Polish Dominions by Korga, are, 'tis said, to advance and take Possession of Cracow the 19th Instant. It is given out here, that King Stanislaus, and the Polish Noblemen that are attach'd to him, are leaving Dantzick. We hear the Palatinates of Polish Prussia, have made a Confederacy for supporting the Election of King Stanislaus, and are raising of Forces, which will infallibly occasion them a Visit from the Russians, who are so filling this Country with Troops, that a Famine is greatly to be feared in a little Time. Forage of all kinds is already very scarce in this Neighbourhood, both Sides destroying and ruining what they meet with, and cannot carry off.

Berlin, Dec. 19, N. S. The King of Prussia being pretty well recovered of his Indisposition, his Majesty proposes to remove to Pottsdam the Beginning of next Week.
