**T**HE King and Queen reside at present at the Palace of Buen-retiro, and often take the Diversion of hunting in that Neighbourhood. The 19th Instant being the King's Birth-Day, when he entred into the 51st Year of his Age, was celebrated at Court as usual. The Birth Day of the Princess of Asturias, who on the 4th Instant entred into the 23d Year of her Age, having not been celebrated on that Day, because their Majesties were then at the Escorial, it was kept on the 18th. The Captain of a Ship which arrived a few Days ago at Barcelona, reports, that on the 8th Instant he met at Sea off Genoa, the Spanish Squadron commanded by the Count de Clavijo, standing for the Coast of Italy with a fair Wind.

*Paris, Jan. 9, N. S.* By Letters from Milan of the 30th past we have the following Account, that the Approaches to the Castle of Milan being carried on in the usual Forms, the Saps were advanced on the 25th to the Covered Way, and necessary Means were used for discovering the Mines which it was believed would be found under the Fortifications of the Covered Way. On the 26th, the Miners employed in that Work finding nothing but Galleries abandoned by the Besieged, the Troops on Duty in the Trenches entered the Covered Way from which the Enemy had retired, and there they lodged themselves by a Parallel the whole Extent of the Attack. The 27th was employed in finishing those Lodgments, and several Batteries were begun to be raised, and that Evening two of them, of four Pieces of Cannon each, began to fire to make Breaches in the Half-Moon. On

the 29th, Preparations were made for making Descents into the Ditch, for which every Thing was in great Forwardness when the Marshal Visconti, who had found himself obliged to abandon the Half-Moon, beat a Parley about Three in the Afternoon. He was required to deliver up one of the Gates of the Castle, which he did on the 30th in the Morning; and soon after Articles of Capitulation were agreed upon. That Afternoon the Marquess de Villars being dispatched to carry the News to the King of the Surrender of the said Castle, arrived here the 4th Instant at Night. The Marquess de Coigny was to march from Milan the 31st past to form the Siege of Navarra.
