Kiferling, a Courland Gentleman, is to fet out in a few Days from hence, to go and refide in Poland as her Ma-jefty's Minister.

Berlin, Jan. 9, N. S. On Monday laft the King of Pruflia made his Will, and fign-ed it in the Prefence of the Prince Royal, and feveral of his Ministers of State, and General Officers. Major General St. Hypolite is fet at Liberty. The King of Prufia went Yefferday to Potzdam, as the Queen propofes to do next Tuefday; and their Prufian Majefties are not expected back before Easter.

Hague, Jan. 15, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland having refumed their Affembly, had a Conference the 11th Instant with the States General on the prefent Situation of Affairs. They have fince taken into Confideration the Claims of the Prince of Orange, and appear to be fo well difpofed towards him, that it is believed they will, before they feparate, join thole Two in the Afternoon till, Five.

other five Provinces which have already confented to the Delivery to his Highness of his Part of the Inheritance of the late King William. Letters from Oppelen of the ift Inftant give an Account, that the Elector of Saxony was arrived there in his Way to Tarnowitz, whither he defigned to proceed on the 4th Inftant. On the 24th of laft Month a Detachment of Saxon Troops pol-feffed themselves of the City and Castle of Cracow without any Oppolition.
