**M.** Westphale, the Danish Envoy, who had resided here near 20 Years, died the 11th Instant of an Apoplexy, it being the third Fit he had within these three Years. Old Count Levenwolde, who is now in Poland, is to return hither after King Augustus's Coronation; and M. Kiserling, a Courland Gentleman, is to set out in a few Days from hence, to go and reside in Poland as her Majesty's Minister.

*Berlin, Jan. 9, N. S.* On Monday last the King of Prussia made his Will, and signed it in the Presence of the Prince Royal, and several of his Ministers of State, and General Officers. Major General St. Hypolite is set at Liberty. The King of Prussia went Yesterday to Potsdam, as the Queen proposes to do next Tuesday; and their Prussian Majesties are not expected back before Easter.

*Hague, Jan. 15, N. S.* The States of the Province of Holland having resumed their Assembly, had a Conference the 11th Instant with the States General on the present Situation of Affairs. They have since taken into Consideration the Claims of the Prince of Orange, and appear to be so well disposed towards him, that it is believed they will, before they separate, join those

other five Provinces which have already consented to the Delivery to his Highness of his Part of the Inheritance of the late King William. Letters from Oppelen of the 1st Instant give an Account, that the Elector of Saxony was arrived there in his Way to Tarnowitz, whither he designed to proceed on the 4th Instant. On the 24th of last Month a Detachment of Saxon Troops possessed themselves of the City and Castle of Cracow without any Opposition.
