*Stockholm*, *Jan. 5.* A French Frigate lately arrived at *Dantzick*, will come hither and winter at *Carlſham*, the French Ambaſſadour having preſented a Memorial for this Purpoſe, and at the ſame time deſired Leave for the Commander of that Veſſel to buy what Cannon and other warlike Ammunition he may have Occaſion for; which has been granted.

*Berlin*, *Jan. 12, N. S.* The Troop of Huſſars quartered in this Town, and three Troops more, under the Command of Lieutenant-Colonel *Beneckendorff*, went Yeſterday to *Potzdami*; on what Occaſion they were ordered thither it is not yet known, they being to receive their Orders To-morrow Morning only. The Princeſs Royal went Yeſterday with the Queen of *Pruſſia* to *Potzdami*, from whence her Royal Highneſs is to proceed To-morrow or next Day to *Brunſwick*, to pay a Viſit to the Dutcheſs her Mother, who, it is ſaid, is indiſpoſed. Count *Seckendorff*, the Imperial Miniſter, deſigns in a Day or two to go to the Court of *Caf-*

ſel, being charged with a private Commiſſion to Prince William of *Heſſe*.

*Hague*, *Jan. 19, N. S.* The States of *Holland* ſeparated on the 16th Inſtant, having firſt agreed with other Five Provinces to the Delivery of the Effects demanded by the Prince of *Orange*; but could not take their final Reſolution upon it, the Deputy and Penſionary of *Dort M. Halewyn*, declaring that he was not empowered to give his Conſent without communicating firſt the Matter to his Town; ſo that it is expected the ſaid Reſolution will paſs finally at the next Meeting of the States of *Holland*, which will be To-morrow Sennight.
