L E T T E R S from Constantinople of the 22d of December, confirm the intire Defeat of the Ottoman Army on the Frontiers of Persia, with the Loss of their Artillery, Ammunition, Tents and Baggage; and that the Death of the Seraskier Topal Osman had been made publick at Constantinople. These Letters add, that the Grand Vizier had declared he would go in Person to take upon him the Command of the Troops; and Orders were dispatched to all Parts for making extraordinary Preparations for the next Campaign.

Copenhagen, Jan. 19, N. S. The Preparations for putting the Body of Troops designed for the Emperour's Assistance into a Condition of marching, are carried on with great Diligence. M. Rosenoern, whose Regiment was appointed for that Service, having obtained his Dismission upon Account of his Age, the Regiment is given to Major-General Scholten; and 'tis said that of Scholten will be given to the younger Margrave.
