Cracow, January 16, N. S.

THE 13th Instant the Bishop of Pof-
 nania, and the Marshal of the Con-
 federacy, after having presented to
 the Elector of Saxony the Diplo-
 ma of his Election to the Crown of Poland,
 invited his Majesty to honour this City with
 his Presence; after which Count Wilzeck,
 Ambassadour from the Emperour, had an
 Audience of his Majesty, as had also Count
 Levenvolde, Master of the Horse to the Cza-
 rina, who delivered him a Letter of Credence
 from her Czarish Majesty. The Prelate and
 Suffragan Bishop of Cracow, a Relation
 of the Primate, who was attached to the
 other Party, has made his Submission to
 King Augustus, as has likewise the Palatin of
 Siradie, Szembeck, Brother to the late Grand
 Chancellor, and it is reported that a great
 many others have the same Intention. Prince
 Sangusko, Marshal of the Court of Lithua-
 nia, is arrived here from his Seat at Wiszic.
 On the 14th King Augustus made his
 Entry into this City on Horseback. Yester-
 day the Interment of the Corpe of the late
 King Augustus the Second was performed in
 the Cathedral Church with the usual Cere-
 monies; and the Coronation of their Maje-
 sties is fixed for To-morrow.

Hague, Jan. 29, N. S. The Town of
 Dort having at last consented to concur with
 the rest of the Members of Holland for the
 Delivery of the Effects demanded by the
 Prince of Orange, the Deputies of Holland
 at the Assembly of the States General de-
 clared this Morning, that they agreed to the
 Resolution of the Five other Provinces for
 the said Delivery; and accordingly it was
 resolved that it shall be forthwith made,
 without regard to Zealand, which still refuses

to consent. The States have sent for the
 Commissaries of the Admiralties, to consult
 them upon the State of their Navy. By the
 last Account from Italy, the Confederate
 Army was going to besiege Tortona, in hopes
 that Town will make no better Defence than
 the rest have done, which were ordered, as
 it is said, not to resist long, in order to save
 the Garrisons. We have Advices here, that
 the Muscovites have made themselves Masters
 of Thorn, and that there was a great Con-
 sternation at Dantzick on their so near Ap-
 proach to that City.
