Hague, Feb. 9, N. S. The Imperial Ministers received an Expres from Vienna last Sunday, and had Yesterday a Conference with the States Deputies. That Expres brought the necessary Acts of the States of Silesia, for securing the Reimbursement of the Monies lent to the Emperour upon the Revenues of that Province, which have been long expected, and had given Occasion to retard the Payment of the Subscribers to the Two Millions designed to be raised.
