*Hague, March 16, N. S.*

**T**HE States of Holland disposed last Week of all the civil and military Employments in their Repartition, except the Command of the Regiment vacant by the Death of the Prince of Nassau Siegen, which is not to be disposed of till their ordinary Assembly in July next; and except likewise the Place of Fiscal for criminal Affairs in the Court of Justice, upon which Holland and Zealand cannot as yet agree, that last Province alledging it to be their Turn to have the Nomination to it, and the other pretending the contrary. The said States have this Day resumed their Assembly and their Deliberations upon their domestick Affairs. Several Schemes have been proposed for raising Money, but none resolved upon as yet; nor is the Million proposed to be negotiated and employed for repairing the Fortifications, and filling up the Magazines, yet consented to by the Province of Holland. Count Sinzendorff has taken his Leave of the States by Memorial, and they have ordered his Recredentials to be prepared, with the usual Present. Count Uhlfeldt, who succeeds his Excellency, had this Morning a Conference with the States Deputies, as had likewise Mr. Finch.

*Hague, March 19, N. S.* The States of Holland now assembled, have been chiefly busy in settling their Opinion delivered to the States General upon the present Juncture of Affairs relating to the Emperor. The College of the Nobles being desired in the Assembly of Holland to fill up the Place which became vacant in the Council of State, by the Death of the Baron de Langerach, M. Vander Duyn, declared he chose the same, resigning his Military Employments.

*Dublin, March 2.*

Yesterday being Her Majesty's Birth-Day, the great Guns were fired at the Barracks, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, who were drawn out upon Oxmantown Green. At Noon there was a splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment His Grace the Lord Lieutenant; before whom an Ode, set to Musick, was performed. In the Evening a Play was given by his Grace to the Ladies. At Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and other Demonstrations of

Joy through the City; and at the Castle there was a magnificent Ball, and an Entertainment given to a vast number of Persons of both Sexes.
