N Monday laft Baron Stain (who was formerly in the late Duke of Brunf-wick's Service, but now in that of the King of Sweden as Landgrave) palled through this Townin his Way to Stockholm; from whence we are informed, that it was refolved on the 27th paft, O.S. in the Senate, that a Diet should be called for the  $\frac{14}{25}$  of May.

Hague, March 23, N. S. The Town of Dantzick having again applied to the States General for their Allistance, and likewife to ule their good Offices with her Czarish Majesty in their Favour, Count Golofkin was Yesterday-invited to a Conference with the Deputies of the States, in which thole Depu-ties reprefented to him, how much their High Mightineffes are concerned for the Welfare of that Town, in the Prefervation of which fo many of their own Subjects are concerned; and how defirous they are that the Czarina would not come to Extremities. Count Golofkin answered, That the Cza-rina had no Defign against the Town, but only to oblige King Staniflaus to quit it; that he was very forry that Town had drawn upon itself to great Inconveniences, but that he was fure her Czarish Majesty would act with the greatest Prudence on this Occasion, fince it was known that the People of Dantzick were not fo much to blame as fome few of the Magisfrates, who were willing to facri-fice the Town and the Interest of the People to their own private Views. He likewife faid, that whatever happened, Care would be taken that the Dutch Merchants should not be Sufferers, and that he would acquaint his Court with what their High Mightineffes had fignified to him. In the mean time it is written from Berlin, that the Muscovites waited only for their great Artillery to attack the Town in Form, having obtained a free Paf-fage for the faid Artillery through the Territories of the King of Prussia. Count d'Uhl-feld, the Emperor's Minister, has had likewile a Conference with the States Deputies, and prefles still for Succours. The Commillioners of the Admiralty being fent for, arrived here Yefterday.

The Ceremony of the Marriage of the Princels Royal with the Prince of Orange, was performed on Thurfday laft in the Evening, and the Procession from the Palace through the Gallery to the Chapel was in the following Manner.

The Procession of the Bridegroom. Fife.

The Master of the Ceremonies proceeded. with one of the chiefest Officers of the Bridegroom.

The Bridegroom in his Nuptial Apparel, invested with the Collar of the Garter, con-ducted by his Grace the Duke of Gralton, Lord Chamberlain, and the Right Hon. the Lord Hervey, Vice-Chamberlain, and sup-ported by the Earls of Scarbrough and Wil-mington, Knights of the Garter, being both Batchelors, wearing their Collars.

The Officers Attendants upon the Bridegroom followed by Pairs, thole of the great-eft Quality going neareft to his Perfon. Upon the Entry into the Chapel, the Ma-

fter of the Ceremonies, with the Gentleman Usher, and Attendants on the Bridegroom, went to the Seats affigned for them; and the Bridegroom was brought by his Conductors and Supporters to the Stool placed for his Highnels next below his Majesty's Chair of State on the Haut-pas, his Supporters retiring to their Seats, where they remained according to their Precedencies among the Peers.
