Berlin, May 1.

THE Ten Thousand Men appointed to serve on the Rhine, marched the 28th of last Month with a Train of Artillery. Letters from the Camp before Dantzick advise, that General Munick had signified to the English and Dutch Merchants, that they should retire from Dantzick, he having received the great Artillery, and intended to begin forthwith to bombard the Town. The Six Thousand Hanoverians began the 26th of last Month their March for the Rhine.

Hague, May 6. An Express is arrived here with Advice, that the Prince and Princess of Orange are arrived in the Maele; upon which Mr. Walpole, Mr. Finch, and M. Dayrolle, and a great many other Persons of Distinction, are gone to Rotterdam to wait upon their Royal and Serene Highnesses.
