Copenhagen, May 15, N. S.

WE have just received Advice, that three French Men of War were entred the Sound, having Troops on board designed for Dantzick.

Francfort, May 20. The Hanoverian Troops having passed by this Neighbourhood, continue their March towards Aschaffembourg, in order to their joining the Imperial Army, which remains still at Heilbron.

Hambourgh, May 21, N. S. On the 19th Instant his Danish Majesty review'd the 6000 Men design'd for the Rhine, which march'd off Yesterday, and this Day pass'd the Elbe. Letters from Poland advise, that 9000 Russians were march'd to join Count Munich's Army before Dantzick; that Major General Count Levenvolde, who commands at Cracow, was set out from thence with the Four Battallions of Saxon Troops that were in Garrison there; that he had Orders to go into Great Poland; and that the other Saxon Troops had also received Orders to join Count Munich with all possible Diligence before Dantzick.

Hague, May 25, N. S. Letters from Berlin of the 18th, confirm the Account of the Action before Dantzick; that the French Succours which are arrived at Wechselfmunde, amount to between two and three Thousand Men; and that they were actually landed under the Cannon of that Fort; but it was not known that they had thrown themselves into the Town.

The Commissioners for managing his Majesty's Stamp Revenues do hereby give Notice, that by a Clause in an Act of last Session of Parliament, intitled, *An Act for ascertaining the Duties upon Arrack, it is (inter alia) enacted to the Effect following: That for the Relief of all Masters and Mistresses who have omitted to pay His Majesty's Duties of Six Pence in the Pound for every Sum of Fifty Pounds or under, and of Twelve Pence in the Pound for every Sum amounting to more than Fifty Pounds, given, paid, contracted, or agreed for, or any Part thereof, with Clerks, Apprentices, or Servants, within the respective Times limited by the several Acts of Parliament in that Case made, or who have omitted to insert and write in Words at Length in the Indentures or other Writings containing the Covenants and Agreements relating to such Clerk, Apprentice, or Servant, the full Sum or Sums of Money, or any Part thereof, received, or in any wise directly or indirectly given, paid, agreed, or contracted for, with or in relation to such Clerk, Apprentice, or Servant, all such Masters and Mistresses, Clerks, Apprentices, and Servants, are acquitted and discharged of and from all Penalties and Incapacities incurred by Reason of such Omissions, upon Payment of the said Rates and Duties on or before the 24th Day of June, 1734.*
