'The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

His Majesty in Council was this Day plea-fed to order the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor to illue Writs for proroguing the Parliament which was appointed to meet on Thursday the 13th of this Instant to Tuefday the 16th Day of July next : And alfo for prorogoing the Convocations of Can-terbury and York, which were appointed to meet on Friday the 21ft of this Inftant, to Friday the 19th Day of the faid Month of July.

Berlin, June 15, N. S. We have an Account by Letters from Konigsberg of the 8th Inftant, that the Mufcovite Fleet, con-fifting of 27 Men of War, great and Imall, with five or fix Transports, arrived at Pillau on the 6th Inftant, and that they were unlading their heavy Artillery; which, as the former, was to come through the Frilch-Haff to the Camp before Dantzick. Mefl. Sul-kowsky and Cetner, and Colonel Phul, with an Engineer and feveral Perfons for the Service of the Artillery, passed through this Town on the 11th Itistant in their Way from Drefden to the Muscovite Camp before Dantzick; and fince then fome of the Domesticks of the Elector of Saxony having followed them, it is supposed that Prince designs also to be there foon in Perfon. Letters from the Ruffian Camp, which are just come in, bring Advice, that the Russian Fleet was arrived in the Road of Dantzick, and that the heavy Artillery was expected every Moment from Pillau. These Letters add, that M. Tarlo, and other Polish Chiefs, had aslembled a very confiderable Body together, and were come into the Neighbourhood of Dantzick.

Hambourg, June 18, N. S. Their Danish Majefties set out Yesterday Morning from Altona, and were faluted by a general Difcharge of the Cannon from the Ramparts of this City. Their Majesties will not remain above Four or Five Days at Hefwig, and then pro-

ceed on their Return to Copenhagen. Hague, June 22; N. S. The States of Hol-land leparated on Saturday laft. They refolved, before their Adjournment, that her Royal Highness the Princess of Orange should be received with the fame Honours as were done to her prefent Britannick Majesty, when Princels of Wales, in her paffing through this Place for England. According to Advices from the Rhine, the Imperial Army was on the 16th at Hailbron, having then laid feveral Bridges over the Mecker, in order to heir palling the fame, and matching towards the French Army. Advices from Dantzick mention the Arrival of the Muscovite Fleet before that Place, having first landed at Pillau

Camp; and that the French Ships of War were fail'd for Copenhagen, and had taken in their Pallage thither a Kullian Frigate.
