Most Gracious Sovereign,

H E Fame of the happy Nuptials of the Princels Royal of Great Britain with his Serene Highnels the Prince of Orange, toge-ther with the universal Joy of the Nation, teffified in their Addreffes to the Throne on this Occafion; as also the very gracious Ac-ceptance which the Addresses of the Protestant Diffenting Minifters, our united Brethren, have found with your Majesty, with your Royal Confort the Queen, and with their Serene Highnefles the Prince and Princess of Orange, encourages us alfo in these distant Eleve Parts of your Majesty's Dominions, to make the most early Representation we can, of our cels.
