Berlin, Aug. 17, N. S. We have now cer-tain Advice that King Staniflaus has fixed his Refidence at Angersburg in Brandenburg Pruffia; in which Place there is a fmall Caftle with a Garrifon, which has been augmented for that Prince's greater Security.

Hague, Aug. 20, N. S. Accordingo the last Advices from the Rhine, the French Army had marched behind Spirebach; and Prince Eugene, instead of pailing the Rhine, was returned towards Heidelberg to observe the Motions of the French.

Hague, Aug. 24, N.S. The States of Holland leparated laft Week, to meet again, as ufual, in September, if not fummoned before. The King of Pruffia is at Wefel, but there is no more Talk of his Majefty's coming to Holland. By the laft Letters coming to Holland. By the laft Letters from the Rhine we have Advice, that a French Detachment, under the Command of the Duke de Noailles, had passed the Rhine at Phillipsbourg, and was encamped at Bruchfal; and that it was thought their Defign was to go and possess themselves of the advantageous Camp of Hailbron ; whereupon Prince Eugene had fent a Detachment under the Command of Prince George of Heffe to prevent it.
