Warsaw, August 24.

WE had an Account the other Day, that a Body of Troops commanded by Count Tarlo, Palatine of Lublin, to the Number of Twenty thousand Horse, and Four thousand Foot, were advanced to Lowietz, with a Train of Artillery, and that they proposed to come on and besiege this City, which is garrisoned by Eight hundred Ruffians and Two hundred Saxons : But Yesterday Intelligence was brought, that the Difficulties of the Enterprize, the little Advantage that could accrue from succeeding in it, and the greater Inconveniencies that would arise from failing in it, being considered in a Council of War at Lowietz, a Resolution was taken to march towards the Palatinate of Sendomir, where it is said the general Rendezvous is appointed for the Polish Troops and Nobility who are in the Interest of King Stanislaus,

From the Imperial Camp at Heidelberg Sept. 3.

The Camp we are now in extends from Leimen to Neckerhausen, where our Right Wing is : The Head Quarters continue in the Neighbourhood of this City. Our Army is sufficiently furnished with Provisions for the Men, but we are in very great Want of Fo-

rage, for which our Parties are obliged to go very far and yet bring in but little. They write from the Kintziger-Thal, that the French have entered the Imperial Town of Offenbourg, and that they have sent Safe-Guards to the Towns of Gengenbach, Zell, and Hammerbach, upon Condition they furnish them with a certain Quantity of Hay and Oats; and that they seem to have no other Design than to gather in all the Provisions and Forage they can in those Quarters.

Berlin, Sept. 4, N. S. Yesterday between Twelve and One at Noon, died at his Country House, in the 58th Year of his Age, his Royal Highness the Margrave Ludewick, Uncle to the King of Prussia. This Prince is generally regretted here, on Account of his many good Qualities, and especially his great Charity.

Hague, Sept. 14, N. S. To-morrow the States of Holland open their Assembly, the greater Part of the Members being already come hither. M. de Waffner formerly Resident from the Emperor at the French Court, is arrived here in his Way to Lisbon being charged with a Commission from his Imperial Majesty, and intends to embark To-morrow on Board the Packet Boat for England. The King of Prussia set out from

Cleves the 9th Instant on his Return to Berlin, being still indisposed. According to the last Advices from the Rhine, the French had repassed that River, having first laid three Villages in Ashes in the Dutchy of Wirtemberg; upon which his Highness the Duke had forbid his Subjects to pay the Contributions.
