Copenhagen, September 14, N. S.

THE Russian Frigate which the French are conducting back to Muscovy, arrived Yesterday, and lies now an at Anchor before this Place.

Berlin, Sept. 14, N. S. This Morning early the King of Prussia arrived at Potzdam from Cleves, but in a very bad State of Health. At Ten the Queen received an Express with Orders to come to Potzdam, and bring all the young Princes and Princeesses with her. Her Majesty set out from hence about an Hour after.

Hague, Sept. 21, N. S. We have Advice here, that the Spaniards in the West-Indies have taken two Dutch Ships, under Pretence that they were trading upon the Coast of Karaquas; which being denied by the Owners of the said Ships, there is great Uneasiness among our Merchants at this Proceeding. The Assembly of the States of Holland continues, notwithstanding the Pensionary is indisposed. We have nothing new here from the Armies in Germany, but that Dispositions seemed to be making for sending them into Winter Quarters.

Whitehall, May 25, 1734.
