The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

His Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order, That the Parliament which stands prorogued to Thursday the Twenty Sixth of this Instant September, should be further prorogued to Thursday the Fourteenth Day of November next. And that the Conventions of the Provinces of Canterbury and York, which stand prorogued to Friday the Twenty seventh of this Instant September, should be further prorogued to Friday the Fifteenth Day of the said Month of November.

Paris, Sept. 25, N. S. The Night before last a Courier arrived at Court from the French Army in Italy, with Advice, that the Imperialists had surpris'd the Marshal de Broglio's Quarters near Bondanello, in the Night between the 14th and 15th Instant; that the Marshal de Broglio saved himself in his Shirt; that his Plate, to the Value of 80,000 Livres, his strong Box, in which were his Jewels and 40,000 Livres in Money, were taken; that M. de Caraman, a Brigadier, who was in the Marshal de Broglio's Quarters, was also taken, with the Marshal's two Aids de Camp; that three Battallions, two of them Piedmontese and one French, were taken, as were also the Horses belonging to the Foot that were at Grass, and all the Baggage belonging to the Marshal de Broglio's Quarters were seized and carried off by the Germans.

Paris, Sept. 26, N. S. The Son of the Marshal de Broglio, and another Officer, are just arriv'd with the News of a Victory obtained over the Imperialists the 19th Instant, with the following Particulars: The

Enemy, who had march'd to Luzara, came and attack'd the Allies the 19th in their Intrenchments between the Crostola and Luzara; the Action began about Ten a-Clock in the Forenoon with great Warmth, and lasted till Four. The Enemy returned thrice to the Charge, and were repuls'd, and retir'd towards Luzara. Count Konigsfegg was dangerously wounded; and seven General Officers of the Emperor were killed, among whom, it is said, is Prince Lewis of Wirtemberg. All the Horse and Dragoons were detach'd in Pursuit of the Germans. Nine Pieces of Cannon, four Pair of Kettle Drums, and 16 Colours or Standards were taken by the Allies.

Hague, Sept. 25, N. S. M. Uhlfeldt has received a Letter from Prince Eugene, by a Courier who pass'd through the Imperial Camp, giving Account of an Action in Italy to the Advantage of the Imperialists. A Detachment of whom early in the Morning on the 15th Instant cross'd the Secchia, and attack'd the French, who were lodg'd on the Banks of that River, and after a short Resistance made themselves Masters of their Castles, by which having cut off the Communication between Quistello, and the main Body of the French Army, the Garrison, which had been plac'd in that Town, attempting to make their Retreat, were intercepted by the Imperialists, who killed 800 and took 700 Prisoners, among whom there were 60 Officers; the Germans in the Action lost one of their Generals named Walchin. The States of Holland separated Yesterday. The last Letters from the Rhine advise, that Prince Eugene had detach'd 14 Battallions for Italy; and that he was upon setting out himself for Vienna. The same Advices add, that the French had no other Thoughts than of Winter Quarters.
