Paris, Oct. 16, N. S. By Letters from the Army of the Allies in Italy, dated the ath of this Month, we have an Account, that on the 27th past they lest the Camp at Guastalla, and marched to Dozolo, where they lay till the 3d Instant, and then moved to the Camp of Commessagio, where these Letters less them. Part of the Right of the Army was extended along the Oglio to its Outlet, and the King of Sardinia had his Quarters at Sabionetto. Prince Eugene had caused three Redoubts in the Isle of Neckerau, to be begun be-fore he left the Army, which Redoubts are to be furnished with Cannon; and left Orders for continuing the Lines which are to extend from the Hill above Heidelberg to Brill, which is a League and a half from Manheim.
