L E T T E R S from Potzdam advise, that his Prussian Majesty continues dangerously ill.

Paris, Oct. 10, N. S. By Letters from the Army of the Allies in Italy, dated the 4th of this Month, we have an Account, that on the 27th past they left the Camp at Guastalla, and marched to Dozolo, where they lay till the 3d Instant, and then moved to the Camp of Comessaggio, where these Letters left them. Part of the Right of the Army was extended along the Oglio to its Outlet, and the King of Sardinia had his Quarters at Sabionetto. Count Konigsegg having passed the Po with his whole Army the 26th of September, posted them facing that River, but on the 29th he changed his Ground, and extended his Right towards Montanara, and posted his Left at Borgoforte, where he fixed his Head Quarters, and by this Situation the Army of the Imperialists have the Fossa Maestra before them. On the 30th, the King of Sardinia and the Marshal de Coigny detached the Marquis de Maillebois with six Squadrons and ten Battalions to form the Siege of Mirandola. The last Letters from the Army on the Rhine are of the 5th Instant, and import, that they continued encamped at Offenbourg, where they were in Barracks; but that Prince Eugene having lent away the greatest Part of his Troops to go into the Winter Quarters assigned them, and the Marshal d'Asfeldt having received

the King's Orders for putting his Troops also into Winter Quarters; was beginning to separate his Army. Prince Eugene set out on the 2d Instant for Vienna. The Troops he has left on the Frontier for the Winter are to be commanded by Prince Alexander of Wirtemberg, who will have his Head Quarters at Hallbron. The Duke of Aremberg is to command in the Black Forrest, and Count Seckendorff at Heidelberg, where some new Fortifications are making. Prince Eugene had caused three Redoubts in the Isle of Neckerath, to be begun before he left the Army, which Redoubts are to be furnished with Cannon; and left Orders for continuing the Lines which are to extend from the Hill above Heidelberg to Brilh; which is a League and a half from Mannheim.

Kensington, October 12.

Yesterday being the Anniversary of their Majesties Coronation, there was a numerous and splendid Appearance at Court of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction. At Noon the Guns in St. James's Park and at the Tower were fired; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, Ringing of Bells, and all publick Demonstrations of Joy throughout London and Westminster.
