M. Utterodt received last Post a Letter from Prince Adolphe Weiffenfeltz to the King of Sweden, desiring his Majesty's Vote and Favour at the Diet of the Empire, where he solicits the Post of General of the Artillery, vacant by the Prince of Bevern's Promotion. Though Prince Maximilian of Hesse-Cassel is a Candidate for the same Employment, his Swedish Majesty very graciously and generously answered, that as there might probably be more than one made, he should be for the Prince of Weiffenfeltz's having the Rank. It is generally thought that our Diet will not last longer than this Month.

Berlin, Oct. 16, N. S. On Tuesday last at Noon the Prince Royal arrived at Potsdam, as he was expected, where he found the Princess his Consort. The Physicians have at last told his Prussian Majesty, that there are no Hopes of his Recovery, of which the King being but too sensible himself, he received that Declaration like a Person well prepared to die. By his Majesty's Order, the Minister of the Garrison-Church at Potsdam comes to him regularly twice or three times a Day; and all Accounts agree that his Prussian Majesty is quiet and easy, and perfectly resigned to the Will of Providence. The Complication of Distempers which his Prussian Majesty had upon him, did at last turn into a Dropsy. From his Head down to the Pit of his Stomach he is grown a perfect Skeleton, and his lower Parts are much swelled, and within these few Days he has had no Feeling in his Legs. The only Care of the Physicians is how to ease him a little, and prolong his Days the most they can, the utmost Period of which, they continue to say, cannot exceed this Month.

Hague, Oct. 19, N. S. The States of Holland continue their Assembly, the Pensionary being so far recovered of his late Fit of the Gout, as to be able to be present at it. The Admiralties have been here for some Days past, to be consulted by the States on Maritime Affairs. His most Serene Highness the Prince of Orange is expected here the latter End of this Month. Letters from the Imperial Army in Italy of the 6th advise, that Count Konigsfegg having received a Reinforcement of 6000 Men, and an Order from Vienna to attack the Allies, let the Consequence be what it would, had left the Seraglio and was advanced towards the Oglio, with a Design to attempt a Passage and bring the Allies to an Action, who were lining the other Side of that River.

Hague, Oct. 22, N. S. The States of Holland will separate To-morrow, and reassume the Assembly on Tuesday next. They have consented, without Guaranty, to the Demand of the Town of Dantzick, to borrow in the Country 200,000 Crowns at Five per Cent, assigning the Customs of the Town for the Payment of the Interest and Capital, the Reimbursement of the said Capital to begin only after Five Years, and to be entirely reimbursed at the End of Nine Years: Though there be no Guaranty of the States, that Sum is already subscribed at Amsterdam. M. Fabricius, one of the two Secretaries of the States of Holland is very ill, and there are already several Competitors for his Employment; M. Visscher, Fiscal of the Admiralty of Rotterdam, formerly Pensionary at Dort, and afterwards at Haerlem, a very able Man, is one of the Chief. Letters from Italy of the 8th Instant give an Account, that upon the Approach of the Imperial Army to the Oglio, M. de Maillebois, who was before Mirandola, had abandon'd the Siege, and was ordered to joyn the main Army of the French with his Body of Troops.
