Warsaw, October 5, N. S.

THE new Regimentary came hither two Days ago with a Guard of about 300 Men, 50 of which were Calmucks; he went away Yesterday to join 4000 Russian Troops, which he left Seven Miles off at a Place called Sochaczow, and from thence will proceed with them in Pursuit of the Palatin of Lublin's Forces, which are march'd towards Sendomir. General Lacy continues still in Polish Prussia about Graudentz; Lieutenant Colonel Milcow is march'd with his Detachment of 200 Dragoons for Kalisch; from whence they are to be sent to their respective Regiments that are posted thereabouts: His Expedition on the other Side of the River was unsuccessful, having march'd several Miles and return'd without finding the Enemy; however some Polish Troops frequently come to Praag, and when any Detachment is sent over the Vistula, they immediately decamp and hide themselves in the Woods that are near. Early this Morning the Saxons surprized a little Party of them, killed three, and took as many Prisoners. The Marshal of the Confederation, M. Poninski, went the Day before Yesterday for Petrikow, to open the Tribunal, being not long ago made Starost of that Place; he is attended by 300 of the Crown Guards, who have Orders to continue there during his Stay.

Berlin, Oct. 19, N. S. The King of Prussia continues still in the same dangerous Way, and without the least Hopes of Recovery. Orders came two Days ago to M. Binger, the King's Surgeon, to repair immediately to Potzdam. His Majesty has been bled twice within this Week, which the Physicians thought proper to do to ease the Oppression on his Breast, it being so great, that he was scarce a Day but he lay some Minutes without Sense or Motion for Want of Breath: Notwithstanding which Bleeding, and some Relief by it, his Majesty had Yesterday another Accident of the like Nature, which lasted some Time. The Ac-

counts from Potzdam agree, that the Prince Royal is Night and Day with the King his Father, between whom, to every body's Joy and Satisfaction, there is the greatest Harmony and good Understanding.
