*The King of Denmark's Declaration in Favour of those Foreign Subjects who may be concerned in the Cargoes of the Hambourg Ships seiz'd and detain'd in Denmark.*

**H**IS Majesty the King of Denmark and Norway, &c. being at length tired with the Obstinacy and unbecoming Behaviour of the Magistrates of the City of Hambourg for so many Years past, after having thought fit, on account of his just Resentment, to cause some Hambourg Ships to be seized, did expect that the said Magistrates, seeing that his Majesty acted in Earnest, would have been induced duly to redress the great Number of just Grievances which his Majesty has Reason to lay to their Charge. But, as on the contrary, the Magistrates still continue even to refuse to make a due and just Reparation for the Damage and intollerable Loss that his Subjects have suffered by the Establishment of a Current Bank, and by putting a Stop, by the Edict published in 1726, to the free Course of his Majesty's good and valuable Coin; his said Majesty, though he be in no wise willing that any Citizen of Hambourg who may not have been much concerned in the insupportable Conduct of the Magistrates, should be a Sufferer thereby, yet finds himself obliged to seek his just Satisfaction, by causing the said Ships detained here, as also the Goods of the Hambourgers on Board, to be actually confiscated. However, as it is not his Majesty's Intention that the Subjects of other Nations should any way suffer by this Resolution, which his Majesty has taken contrary to his Inclination, his Majesty has given express Orders to his High Admiralty Court to take Care, with the utmost Exactness, that no other Ships or Goods but such as belong to the City of Hambourg should be confiscated. Of all which his Majesty has ordered Notice to be given to all the Foreign Ministers residing at his Court, that they may be pleased to apprise in good Time the Subjects of their respective Sovereigns who may be interested in the said Ships and their Cargoes, of this his Majesty's favourable Resolution, that they may be enabled, before the Expiration of three Months, to make their Claim at his Majesty's High Court of Admiralty here at Copenhagen, by producing such Proofs and Documents as they have; where every one shall be heard and treated according to Justice and Equity, with all Manner of Kindness.
