Warsaw, December 16, N. S.

THE Prince Regimentary Wiefnowiesky, with the Palatin of Trok, arrived here last Night. The Bishop of Plosk waits at Pultaußh for M. Poniatowski, and the Marshal Belinski, who are daily expected there. Probably they have met with Difficulties in passing the Rivers, otherwise they must have been here before this Time. No doubt is made of their Steadiness to King Augustus, after the positive Assurances they gave, and the Oath they took at Dantzick. Colonel Sibilski, a famous Partizan of King Augustus, is gone with 700 Light Horse in Pursuit of the Palatin of Lublin, who, it was advised, was separated from the Army. A Person is just arrived here from M. Poniatowski, to acquaint the Court of his coming; but the Bishop of Plosk desires to be excused for the present, his Lands having suffered so much, that he is not able to support the Expence of living at Warsaw; however, if the King had Business for him, and ordered his Attendance, he would nevertheless obey.

Berlin, Dec. 25, N. S. Advice came hither two Days ago from Dresden, that Count Hoym had shot himself through the Head, upon Colonel Natzmar's coming to him with an Order from the Elector of Saxony to conduct him to the Fortrefs of Konigstein; but we are not yet informed of what is laid to his Charge. As these Letters came away, Count Hoym was not quite dead, the Ball not having done his Business so effectually as he intended. The Letters from Potzdarn say, that the King took the Air on Thursday last in a Coach, which has lately been made after his own, and his Physicians Directions.
