No doubt is made of their Steadiness to King Augustus, after the positive Assurances they gave, and the Oath they took at Dantzick. Colonel Sibilski, a famous Partizan of King Augustus, is gone with 700 Light Horse in Pursuit of the Palatin of Lublin, who, it was advised, was separated from the Army. A Person is just arrived here from M. Poniatowski, to acquaint the Court of his coming; but the Bishop of Plosk desires to be excused for the present, his Lands having suffered so much, that he is not able to support the Expence of living at Warsaw; however, if the King had Business for him, and ordered his Attendance, he would nevertheless obey.
