THE Meeting of the Assembly of the States of Holland is fixed for the 12th Instant. His most Serene Highness the Prince of Orange talks of making shortly a Tour into Friesland, where his Presence is necessary for the changing of the Magistrates. Letters from Italy confirm the Advices we had of the Imperialists having repass'd the Po, without the Loss of one single Man. The same Letters add, that the French had received the Reinforcement of ten Battallions that they expected.
