Warsaw, January 6, N. S.

WE have received Advice here, that Lieutenant General Sagrasky has passed with his Troops over the Vistula at Casimir, and met with little Opposition, the Poles firing only a few Shot with long Guns, and retiring upon the Ruffians planting their Cannon at them: 'Tis said they are gone toward Sanock, which is near the Mountains of Hungary. Major General Backmentoff, with his Body of Troops, passed the River about Mielecz, and Colonel Sibilsky is at Sandomir with 800 Light Horse, and they reckon now that this Side of the River is quite clear of the Troops of King Stanislaus's Party. As the Prince of Hesse Hombourg is arrived at Leopold, and Major-General Keith not far from him, they hope to encompass the Enemy in such a Manner as to put them to the utmost Difficulties. We have News that the Palatin of Kiovy has refused acceding to the late general Confederation, as also the Great Marshal Mniszecz. The Palatin of Rulna, and his Brother the Prince Abbot Czartorinski, arrived here this Day from Dantzick. The Bishop of Warmia arrived here the Day before Yesterday. The Deputies of several Palatinates have made their Submission to King Augustus.

Hague, Jan. 21, N. S. On the 19th Instant in the Evening we had so terrible a Storm here, that most of the Houses of this Place were damaged, and many Trees torn up by the Roots. 'Tis advised from Amsterdam, that a great Number of Ships were lost in the Texel; and we expect to hear of further Losses by Sea.

Paris, Jan. 22, N. S. We have an Account from Turin, that the Queen of Sardinia died there on the 13th of this Month, in the 29th Year of her Age; and the King of Sardinia being under very great Affliction, was gone to the Monastery of Carthusians at Colegno, there to pass nine Days in Retirement.

Admiralty-Office, Jan. 7, 1734.

The Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty being informed, that, notwithstanding His Majesty's Pleasure, signified to his Consuls residing in Foreign Parts, several Masters of Ships and Vessels belonging to His Majesty's Subjects which have come into the Ports where they the said Consuls reside, have upon their Demand, refused to produce to them the Passes which they have received, in order to their endorsing the same in the Manner they are required to do: Their Lordships do therefore hereby give Notice, that it is expected all such Masters of Ships or Vessels coming into any Port where there is any such Consul, do, at their Peril, strictly comply with his Majesty's Pleasure, by producing to them the Passes in their Possession; and that when any Ship or Vessel belonging to his Majesty's Subjects shall be sold at any Port abroad, where a British Minister or Consul doth reside, their Masters do deliver to such Minister or Consul their Pass; or if no such Minister or Consul, transmit them as soon as possible they can to this Office, in order to their being cancelled, that so they may not, to the Prejudice of the Trade of His Majesty's Subjects, fall into the Hands of Foreigners, otherwise their Bonds will be put in Suit with the utmost Severity of the Law. And their Lordships do hereby give Notice to all Masters of Ships or Vessels belonging to His Majesty's Subjects who may receive Passes, either from this Office, or from any of the Governors of His Majesty's Foreign Islands or Plantations, that by an Act passed in the Fourth Year of his present Majesty, it is made Felony, without Benefit of the Clergy, if any Erasure or Alteration whatsoever shall be found made in any such Passes.
