Whitehall, February 11, 1734-5. Whereas it has been represented to His Majesty, that on Tuesday the 4th Day of February Instant, Five Horsemen, armed each with a Case of Pistols, came about Seven a-Clock in the Evening, to the House of Joseph Lawrence the Elder, being part of a Farm called Earlesbury Farm, near Edgware, in the County of Middlesex, and went into the Sheep House, where a Servant was, whose Hands they tied behind him, and by Servant was, whole Hands they tied behind him, and by threatund to fhoot him, and clapping Piflels to his Body, compelled him to go with them to his Mafter's the Said Joseph Lawrence's House, in order to get the Door opened; which was accordingly done, and they all then entered the House with Piflols in their Hands, in which was the said Joseph Lawrence, who is an Ancient Man upwards of Seventy Tears of Age, a Servant Man, and Maid; that they bound the said Man and Maid, and forced the Master up Stairs to thesy them where his and forced the Master up Stairs to shew them where his Money was, and broke open all the Doors, Chefts and Places, and thoroughly fearched every Part of the House, and not finding the Money they expected, upon their coming down Stairs most inhumanly and barba-rously abused the said Joseph Lawrence, by beating him with a Stick till they Broke it to pieces, letting down his Breeches and whipping him in a violent Manner, that they likew fe laid a Faggot on the Fire and laid him down by it, and threatned to burn him, then took a Knife and drew it under his Throat, and declared they would cut his Throat, and afterwards dragged him by the Hur of his Head about the Kitchen, then took a Kettle of Water from off the Fire, and thread the Was ter upon him: That they took from the House of the said Lawrence, about Twenty Five Pounds in Money, one Silver Cup, several Silver Spoons, and all she Linnen in the House, and that one of them ravuled t'e Maid Servant; they continued in the House about an Hour and an Half, bound all the Fimily, lock'd the Door, and carried away the Kry, having first declared they would go to the next House, being other Part of the said Farm, and serve that Family in like Manner, but
