Warsaw, February 12, N. S.

THIS Morning the Queen was brought to Bed of a Princess.

Berlin, Feb. 22, N. S. On Thursday last the Prince of Lichtenstein, who is charged with a particular Commission from the Emperor to the King of Prussia, arrived here, and the Sunday following he went to Potsdam, where we hear the Court of Bevern was expected Yesterday Evening. M. Bestuchef, who is appointed by the Czarina to succeed M. Brackel at the Court of Copenhagen, passed through this Place Yesterday in his Way to that Court.

Hague, March 1, N. S. M. de Catwyck's Affair was decided last Saturday in his Favour by the States of the Province of Holland; the Deputies of twelve Towns, which had declared for him, against seven, persisting in their Resolution. The States of Holland separated the same Day to re-assemble Tomorrow Fortnight.

Whitehall, February 21, 1734-54
