Petersbourg, February 22, O. S.

ON Thursday Morning last Felt-Marshal Count Munich set out from hence for Poland, to take upon him the Command of her Czarish Majesty's Troops in that Kingdom. General Count Levenvold continues very much indisposed, and has asked Leave to retire to his Estate in Livonia; which her Majesty has granted him.

Berlin, March 19, N. S. Our last Advices from Poland say, that the Poles under Count Tarlo are at present in the Neighbourhood of Karga; that Prince Adolph of Weissenfels, with between 3 and 4000 Saxons, is but three German Miles from them, and that Count Tarlo had sent to him a Message consisting of the Three following Points. 1. To consent to an Armistice. 2. That they might have an Interview together. 3. That there should be an Exchange of the Prisoners made on both Sides. The Prince, as we hear, has agreed to the 2d Point, but pleaded Want of Authority to treat upon the 1st and 3d. On Wednesday last, M. Oesrowsky Quarter Master General of Poland, who arrived here some Days ago from King Stanislaus, had an Audience of the King of Prussia, and Yesterday he proceeded on his Journey to Paris. His Prussian Majesty has appointed Prince Leopold of Anhalt, Eldest Son of the Prince Regent of that Name, to be Lieutenant General of his Forces.

Berlin, March 22, N. S. His Prussian Majesty had Yesterday an Account by Express, that the Poles under the Command of Count Tarlo, had, after setting Fire to Karga, retired into his Majesty's Dominions, viz. Count Tarlo with one Column or Division to Zeulichan, General Steinflicht with another to Oblat, and a third Division to Crossen. On

Saturday Evening last a Memorial was sent to General Pretorius, the Danish Minister, by which this Court insists a-new on the Danish Troops evacuating Ost-Friesland, and on the Restitution of their Merchants Effects detained on board the Hambourg Ships which were taken last Autumn by the Danes, The Prince of Anhalt is on the mending Hand.
