Copenhagen, March 29, N. S.

M. Lewenorn, who had the Superintendency of the Commissioners both for Land and Sea Service, as well as the Post of Secretary at War, has now resigned the former Charge, and accordingly took his Leave Yesterday of that Board: He is succeeded by Count Danneskiold Samsoe, whose successful Application to the Service, especially in Things relating to the Navy, begins to be much taken Notice of and encouraged by the King. Rear Admiral Bille, who had the Inspection of the Holme, and consequently of the Fleet, is dismissed from that Employment, which is given to Commodore Suhm. Last Night about Nine a-Clock, the Body of the late Princess Sophia Hedwig was carried in great Solemnity from her Palace of Charlottenburg, in order to be interred this Day at Bofchild. The Windows in every Street through which the Procession passed, were illuminated, with Decorations proper to the Occasion; Minute Guns were fired from the Ramparts, and no usual Mark of Respect or Ceremony omitted.
