FTER a long Deliberation in the Council of State for removing the Garrisons, which usually are changed every three Years, and have this time continued four where they are, it has been resolved that only the Cavalry shall be removed, except that Part which is in the Towns of the Barrier, being only four Squadrons. The States of Holland, will be here on Wednesday next, to meet the Day sollowing. Letters from Naples give an Account, that on the 9th past Don Carlos arrived at Messina (the Citadel of which the Imperialists had surrendred upon Capitulation;) that he had detached some Batallions to take Possession of Syracuse and Trapani, the Garrisons of which Places had also desired to capitulate; and that Preparations were making for his publick Entry into Messina, as King of Sicily, the whole Island being reduced to his Obedience. From Mantua it is advised, that Count Konigsegg being lately arrived there from Vienna, was making all the Pre-parations necessary for entring soon upon Action. In Germany, the Forces on both Sides are also preparing for an early Campaign.
