*Warsaw, March 31, N. S.*

**S**INCE the 24th Instant the Court has received no Letters from Prince Weissenfelds, so that they have no positive Accounts of his having had an Interview with the Palatin of Lublin, or of any thing that has passed in those Parts; they however still imagine that their Troops and the Russians are so well posted, that it will be almost impossible for the Confederates to escape them; though there are private Advices here, which say, that they found means to get away, and that the said Palatin did not meet the Prince as was agreed upon, but sent him word that the Confederates would not consent to it; and that there had been some little Skirmishes between them and the Saxon Troops, but the Advantage is differently talked of. It is also said that most of the Confederates are gone back towards Cracow, where General Leslie is at present with a considerable Body, so that it is hoped they may have fallen into his Hands. The said General wrote from Kalisz the 21st, that he was got thither with 4000 Horse, and had acquainted Prince Weissenfelds with his Motions. Felt-Marihal Munich is expected here within a few Days to take upon him the Command of the whole Russian Army which is in Poland and Lithuania. The Court has just received News of their

Troops having defeated the Confederates, and that the Palatin of Lublin, with the Starosti Jacelsky, are retired to Frankfort upon the Oder.

*Hague, April 15, N. S.* The States of the Province of Holland assembled Yesterday, and it is believed will not separate till the End of next Week. The Great Pensionary being pretty well recovered, went to Day to assist in the said Assembly. Since Mr. Walpole's Arrival here, he has had frequent Conferences with the chief Persons in the Administration of this Republick.

The Rt.
