TINCE the 24th Inftant the Court has received no Letters from Prince Weiffenfelds, fo that they have no politive Accounts of his having had an Inter-view with the Palatin of Lublin, or of any thing that has palled in those Parts; they however still imagine that their Troops and the Ruffians are lo well posted, that it will be almost impossible for the Confederates to cleape them; though there are private Ad-vices here, which fay, that they found means to get away, and that the faid Palatin did not meet the Prince as was agreed upon, but fent him word that the Confederates would not confert to it; and that there had been fome little Skirmishes between them and the Saxon Troops, but the Advantage is differently talked of. It is also faid that most of the Confederates are gone back to-wards Cracow, where General Lellie is at prefent with a confiderable Body, fo that it is hoped they may have fallen into his Hands. The faid General wrote from Kalifh the 21st, that he was got thither with 4000 Horle, and had acquainted Prince Weilfenfelds with his Motions. Felt-Marihal Munich is expected here within a few Days to take upon him the Command of the whole Rufhah Army which is in Poland and Lithuania. The Court has just received News of their |

Troops having defeated the Confederates, and that the Palatin of Lublin, with the Starofti Jacelsky, are retired to Frankfort upon the Oder.
