TINCE the 24th Inflant the Court has received no Letters from Prince Weiffenfelds, so that they have no positive Accounts of his having had an interview with the Palatin of Lublin, or of any thing that has passed in those Parts; they however still imagine that their Troops and the Russians are to well posted, that it will be almost impossible for the Consederates to cleape them; though there are private Advices here, which fay, that they found means to get away, and that the said Palatin did not meet the Prince as was agreed upon, but fent him word that the Confederates would not confent to it; and that there had been fome little Skirmithes between them and the Saxon Troops, but the Advantage is differently talked of. It is also said that most of the Consederates are gone back to-wards Cracow, where General Leslie is at present with a considerable Body, so that it is hoped they may have fallen into his Hands. The faid General wrote from Kalish the 21st, that he was got thither with 4000 Horse, and had acquainted Prince Weissenselds with his Motions. Felt-Marthal Munich is expected here within a few Days to take upon him the Command of the whole Ruffiah Army which is in Poland and Lithuania. The Court has just received News of their

Troops having defeated the Confederates, and that the Palatin of Lublin, with the Starosti Jacelsky, are retired to Frankfort upon the Oder.

The Great Pensionary being pretty well recovered, went to Day to assist in the said Assembly. Since Mr. Walpole's Arrival here, he has had frequent Conferences with the chief Persons in the Administration of this Republick.
