**W**E have Advices from Madrid of the 5th Instant, that the principal Moors inhabiting the Country of Beniamer, appeared before Oran, and proposed to the Governour, on the Part of most of the Inhabitants of that Country, to become Subjects to the King of Spaiti. Accordingly a Treaty was fetted with them, by which they promise entire Obediēce and inviolable Fidelity to him, and particularly engage to supply constantly the Town of Oran with all Sorts of Provisions, on Condition his Majesty will assure them of his Protection, and treat them as his Subjects. Letters from Messina of the 26th of March advise, that Prince Lobkowitz, with the Garrison of that Citadel, having marched out of it according to the Articles of Capitulation, the Ships provided to carry them to Trieste would be ready to put to Sea in a few Days. The Imperialists, who defend Siracuse under General Roma; refusing to accept of any Terms of Surrender, Don Carlos had ordered all necessary Preparations to be made for reducing them by a Siege in Form, and it was believed would repair in Person to the Camp before that Place.

Hague, April 26, N. S. The Prince of Orange sets out from hence the 28th Instant for Guelderland, to be present at an Assembly of the States of that Province. Don Louis Da Cunha, Minister from the King of Portugal, has frequent Conferences with the Deputies of the States. M. Glabbeck is made Colonel of Artillery, in the Room of Brigadier Verschuur, deceased.
