ON the 7th Instant the French Ambassadour received the Answer of the Allies, to the Plan of Accommodation between the Powers in War; which he communicated the same Day to the President of the States, as did also the Spanish Ambassadour: and it was delivered to Count d'Uhfeldt the Emperor's Minister, in a Conference the States Deputies held with him Yesterday. The Deputies from Guelderland proposed Yesterday to the Assembly of the States General a Promotion of General Officers, particularly the Prince of Orange to be made General of the Foot; the same having been proposed lately by the Deputies from Friesland. This Proposal was sent to Day to the States of Holland, who resumed their Assembly this Morning.
