#### Hague, May 10, N.S.

N the 7th Inftant the French Ambafladour received the Answer of the Allies, to the Plan of Accom-modation between the Powers in War; which he communicated the fame Day to the Prefident of the States, as did alfo the Spanish Ambassadour: and it was delivered to Count d'Uhlefeld the Empe-rour's Minister, in a Conference the States Deputies held with him Yesterday. The Deputies from Guelderland propoled Yelterday to the Allembry of the States General a Promotion of General Officers, particularly the Prince of Orange to be made General of the Foot; the fame having been proposed lately by the Deputies from Frief-land. This Proposal was fent to Day to the States of Holland, who refumed their Affembly this Morning.
