THE States of Holland continue their Session, but the Grand Pensionary, being Yesterday confined to his Chamber by Indisposition, cannot assist in their Assembly. The Emperour's Envoy has delivered to the States General a Memorial, concerning the Cessation of Arms proposed in the Plan of Pacification. Our Advices from the Rhine, are in Substance, that the Imperialists were drawing out of their Quarters, in order to be ready to take the Field on the Arrival of Prince Eugene, who was speedily expected. And that the like Preparations were making by the French, commanded in chief by the Marshal de Coigny.
