Berlin, May 28, N. S.

Y our last Letters from Poland, and Konigsberg we have Advices, that the Ruffians, under the Command of General Biron, had purfued fome Polish Parties, the Remains of M. Pociey's difperfed Army, as far as Angersburg, a Town in his Prussian Majesty's Dominions, where, or in that Neighbourhood, the faid Ruffians had, in feveral Rencounters, killed or taken Prisoners a great Number of the Poles. The Prince of Lichtenstein left this Place on Monday Evening last on his Return to Vienna. The Court is expected in Town in a few Days from Potzdam; and they fay the General Review will be made here, as ulual, towards the latter End of the next Week.

Copenhagen, May 3r, N. 8. The Danih Court, augmented by the Princels Dowager of Ooft-Frile, is now removed from Walloc to Hircholm, where they talk of fpending Six Weeks. 'Tis generally believed that the King of Denmark intends this Summer to vifit Laland, Falfter and the other little Iflands in the Baltick belonging to his Dominions.

Hanover, June 7, M. S. On Sunday the 23th of laft Month, his Majeffy landed at Hulvoetfluys, between Five and Six in the Affernoon, under a triple Difcharge of the Cannon, and went immediately in a Coach for the Brille, where ha was faluted by a Difcharge of the Cannon from the Ramparts, and srofs'd over to Maeffandfluys; from whence his Majeffy proceeded to Rotterdama, and palled through that City between Eight and Nine in the Evening, beiog alfo faluted by a triple Difcharge of the Cannon there, and arrived at Utrecht after Midhight, and refted at M. Pouchoud's, his Majeffy's Electoral Commiffary at that Place. The next Morning, being Monday the 30th, his Majeffy fet forward about Eight, and came to Bentheim that Evening where his Majeffy was likewife faluted by a triple Difcharge of the Cannon from the Caftle, and fupped and refted there that Night : To which

Place from Maeflandfluys, his Majefty way attended by Parties of Dutch Troops. Thenext Morning, being Tuelday, the 31ft, his Majefty fet out from thence for Dippernau, attended by Parties of Dragoons, of his own Troops, and got thither, about Seven in the Evening, and was complimented by a great Number of Perfors of Diffinction on his fafe Arrival in his German Dominions. His Majefty furped and lay there that Night, and the next Morning, the 1ft Inftant, his Majefty fer forward about Nine, for Herrenhaulen, attended by freft Parties of Dragoons, where he arrived about Five an Clock in the Alternoon, in perfect Health, and was received and complimented by the Regency, and a great Number of the Nobility, and other Perfons of Diffinction. Laft Night between Nine and Ten, the Right Honourable, the Lord Harrington arrivedy here, and this Day his Lordfhip waited on his Majefty at Herrenhaufen.

Hague, June 10, N.S. To-morrow the Prince of Orange, with the Princefs Royal, will fet out from hence for Soefdyk, where they will flay fome Days, and then go to Friefland; they will afterwards go to Guelderland, and pass fome Time at Loo and Dieren; bis. Highness's making the Cam<sup>2</sup> paign being not yet abfolutely determined.
