P R E S E N T,

The Queen's most Excellent Majesty, Guardian of the Kingdom of Great Britain, and His Majesty's Lieutenant within the same, in Council.

Her Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order, That the Parliament which stands prorogued to Thursday the 12th of this Instant, should be further prorogued to Thursday the 31st Day of July next.

*Hanover, June 18, N. S.* On the 12th Instant in the Evening, Count Kinsky, the Emperour's Ambassadour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, arrived here from England. The same Day M. Benckendorff arrived here from Wolfenbittel, and had Yesterday an Audience of the King, at which he complimented his Majesty on the Part of her most Serene Highness the Dutchess Dowager of Wolfenbittel, Mother of the Present Empress-Consort, upon his safe Arrival in his German Dominions. The 14th about Eight in the Morning, his Majesty, attended by the Regency, the Right Hon. the Lord Harrington, and a great many of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, went on Horseback from Herrenhausen to a Plain near this City, where he review'd the Regiment of Foot Guards commanded by Colonel Ilton: They marched in Companies till they came to the Tent where his Majesty was, and filed off Man by Man, and then resumed their former Ground. They performed their Exercise, Evolutions and Firings, form'd the Square and reduced it. They afterwards marched by his Majesty by half Divisions. This Exercise continued from between Nine and Ten till One, when his Majesty returned in a Chaise to Herrenhausen very well satisfied with it. He was saluted by the Artillery both at his coming and going. The same Day M. de Holle, President of the Finances to the Duke of Wirtemberg, had his Audience of the King, and complimented his Majesty on the Part of his Highness, upon his Majesty's Arrival in his German Dominions. The 16th the Syndick Kohne and the Senator Buhren, deputed by the City of Bremen to compliment the King on his Arrival, had their Audience. Yesterday in the Evening a French Comedy was acted at the Theatre in Herrenhausen Gardens. To-morrow in the Evening his Highness Prince William of Hesse Cassel, and his Son Prince Frederick, are expected to come hither. On Monday next, the 20th Instant, his Majesty intends to begin the grand Review of his Troops in this Neighbourhood, consisting of three Regiments of Horse, two of Dragoons, and eight of Foot.

*Hague, June 21, N. S.* The reassembling of the States of the Province of Holland is fixed to Wednesday next. M. de Chavigny

set out to Day for Hanover, taking his Way by Amsterdam. While he was here, he and the Marquess de Fenelon had several Conferences with the Ministers of this State.

*Kensington, June 11.*

This Day being the Anniversary of His Majesty's Succession to the Crown, there was a numerous and splendid Appearance at Court of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment Her Majesty on that happy Occasion. The Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired, and all publick Demonstrations of Joy were made.
