ON Tuesday the 28th of last Month, M. Von Stuterheim, Grand Marshal to the Duke of Saxe Eisenach, who was sent hither on the Part of his most Serene Highness, to compliment the King on his safe Arrival in his German Dominions, had his Audience of Leave of his Majesty, and set out next Morning for his Court, well satisfied with the Reception he had met with here. The same Day in the Evening Prince Frederick, Son to Prince William of Hesse, took his Leave of his Majesty, and set out Yesterday Morning for Cassel. Yesterday at Noon the Deputies of the City of Hambourg, sent to compliment his Majesty on his Arrival here, had their Audience of the King; after which, Prince Lubomirsky and General Bauditz were presented to his Majesty.
