Count No-Atitz, who arrived here on Friday last in the Evening, was introduced the next Day to an Audience of the King, and complimented his Majefty on the Part of the Prince of Schwartzbourg Sundershausen his Master, upon his Majesty's Arrival here. The Baron de Lowe, Dean of Hildesheim, had Yesterday his Au-dience of the King, and complimented his Majesty upon the same Occasion, on the Part of the Elector of Cologne.
