

last past committed, or hereafter shall commit, any Murder whatsoever, or any Robbery with open Force and Violence, in any Street, Highway, Road, Passage, Field, or open Place, in the Cities of London or Westminster, or within Five Miles round the same, so as such Offender be convicted of the said Offences, or any of them, shall have and receive for every such Offender so apprehended and convicted, as aforesaid, the said Sum of One hundred Pounds Sterling, mentioned in the said Proclamation, over and above all other Rewards to which such Person or Persons may by any Act of Parliament be intitled, which said Sum of One Hundred Pounds, for every Offender so apprehended and convicted, as aforesaid, the Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury, or his High Treasurer of Great Britain for the Time being, are hereby directed and required to pay accordingly, without any further or other Warrant in that Behalf; and if the Person so discovering and apprehending any Offender guilty of any such Murder or Robbery, as aforesaid (except the Person actually giving a Wound in any such Murder) shall have been an Accomplice in any such Murder or Robbery, and by reason thereof shall stand in need of his Majesty's most gracious Pardon, We do hereby further promise and declare, That such Person shall have his Majesty's most gracious Pardon.

*Warsaw, July 2, N. S.* Yesterday Morning the Suffragan of Cracow was sent to the Primate, with the Orders for the Russian Guard to withdraw and leave him entirely at his Liberty; and he is expected at Warsaw in a few Days. The Bishop of Cracow intends to go meet him at Blony, four Miles from hence, as also the Castellain of Cracow, the Palatin of Kioy, the Grand Marshal, and several others of his Friends. The Bishop of Cujavia is at present with him, and waits to accompany him hither. The Diet is fixed for the 27th of September, and the Dietines are to be held the 16th of August, but the Universals are not yet issued out. The Deputies of Podolia, Kalish and Camienieck, have had publick Audience of King Augustus, to make their Submission and Acknowledgments.
