## Hanovers July 27, N.S.

N the 19th Inftant M. Nifchwitz had an Audience of the King, and complimented his Majeffy upon his happy Arrival in this Country, on the Part of his Mafter his Highnefs Duke Chriftian Lewis, Adminiftrator of Mecklenbourg. On the 22d the Baron de Ridefell, who was come hither upon the fame Occafion on the Part of the Landgrave of Helle Darmftadt, had his Audience of Leave of his Majefty; and is preparing to return to his Court. On the 23d, about Eight a-Clock in the Morning, the King, attended by my Lord Harrington, the Foreign Minifters, and feveral other Perfons of Diftinction, went to Wifenbrook Foreft, near Celle, where the Peafants had brought into the Toils feveral wild Beafts; and his Majefty after the Divertion of thooting fome wild Boars and Foxes, returned about Six in the Evening to Herenhaufen. The fame Day the Right Hon. the Earl of Rockingham arrived here from his Travels in Italy, and other Parts of Europe; and in the Evening waited on the King at Herenhaufen, who received him very gracioufly; and on Monday the 25th, in the Evening, his Lordthip took his Leave of his Majefty, and fet out Yefterday Morning for the Hartz, from whence he intends to pafs into France in his Return to England.
