Petersbourg, July 16, N. S.

A few Days ago arrived a Courier from the Czarina's Minister at Constantinople, with an Account, that upon his Inquiry on what Service an Army of 80000 Crim-Tartars, newly drawn together and headed by their Cham, was to be employed, the Grand Vizier assured him, that those Tartars were not permitted by the Porte to take the Field with any Design to invade or to disturb the Peace of the Russian Provinces, but only to make a strong Diversion, to oblige Thamas Kouli Kan to divide his Forces. This Court however, to prevent all Surprize, is taking proper Measures for opposing the Tartars, in case they should (notwithstanding the Vizier's Promise) make any Attempt upon the Czarina's Dominions. In the mean while, an Express is arrived from Thamas Kouli Kan's Army, with the News that he had attack'd and totally defeated a numerous Body of Turks.

Paris, Aug. 10, N. S. Letters from Palermo of the 4th of last Month relate, that Don Carlos made his solemn Entry into that City on the 30th of June, and on the 3d of July was crowned King of both Sicilies with all the Ceremony and Magnificence used on such Occasions. 'Tis advised from Naples the 21st past, that Don Carlos returned thither on the 11th. Before his Departure from Palermo, he nominated the Marquês de Villareal to be Viceroy of Sicily.

Hanover, Aug. 9, N. S. On Saturday last M. Azêvedo, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Portugal, who arrived here the Night before, had an Audience of his Majesty at Herenhaußen.
