THE Right Hon. the Lord Lovelace having taken Leave on Wednesday last of the King at Herrenhausen, his Lordship set out from hence the next Morning for England, and intends to pay his Respects to the Prince and Princess of Orange at Loo in Holland, in his Way home. M. Chavigny, Minister from the most Christian King to the King of Great Britain, who lately went from hence to the Court of Berlin, returned hither from thence Yesterday Morning. Letters from Vienna of the 3d Instant, N. S. say there were Advices from Turkey of the Grand Vizier's being deposed and sent away on Board a Vessel; and that a certain Bashaw of Egypt was made Grand Vizier in his Room.
