THEREAS her Majefty has fignified to Us her Royal Pleafure, that the Parliament of this Kingdom, which now ftands prorogued to Thursday the Seventh Day of this Instant August, be further prorogued to Tuesday the Seventh Day of October next; on which Day it is her Majesty's Pleasure that they should meet to do Business: We do therefore hereby publish and declare, that the faid Parlia-ment be, and accordingly the faid Parliament is hereby further prorogued to Tuefday the Seventh Day of October next; and that the fame shall be then held at Dublin, and fit for the Difpatch of Bulines: Whereof the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Commons in this present Parliament are to take Notice, and to give their Attendance accordingly.
