WHEREAS her Majesty has signified to Us her Royal Pleasure, that the Parliament of this Kingdom, which now stands prorogued to Thursday the Seventh Day of this Instant August, be further prorogued to Tuesday the Seventh Day of October next; on which Day it is her Majesty's Pleasure that they should meet to do Business: We do therefore hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament be, and accordingly the said Parliament is hereby further prorogued to Tuesday the Seventh Day of October next; and that the same shall be then held at Dublin, and fit for the Dispatch of Business: Whereof the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Commons in this present Parliament are to take Notice, and to give their Attendance accordingly.

GOD save the KING.

Berlin, Aug. 13, N. S. Yesterday in the Evening the King of Prussia came hither, and next Week he goes to Wusterhausen, where he proposes to pass the Hunting Season, as usual: His State of Health, in all Appearance, grows daily better.

Hanover, Aug. 16, N. S. On the 11th Instant the Count de Schulenburg, a Colonel in the Service of his Imperial Majesty, and who lately came hither on the Part of her Imperial Majesty, to make her Compli-

ments to the King on his Arrival in these his Dominions, had his Audience of Leave of his Majesty, and set out in the Afternoon from hence to go to the Army on the Upper Rhine. The same Day in the Evening Baron Hattorf, one of his Majesty's Ministers of State, who some Weeks ago had obtained the King's Leave to go to his Country Seat at Boheme to drink the Pyrmont Waters, returned from thence, having found great Benefit thereby. This Morning his Majesty, attended by the whole Court, went to the Mountains called the Duysters, about 14 English Miles from hence, where having taken the Diversion of spearing and shooting several wild Boars, he returned to Herenhau- sen about Five in the Afternoon.

His Majesty having been graciously pleased by his Warrant under his Royal Sign Manual, dated the 10th of June, 1733, to establish certain Rules and Orders for the better Government of the Charity for the Relief of poor Widows of Commission and Warrant Officers of the Royal Navy: These are to give Notice to all such Widows as aforesaid, whose Husbands died on or since the 30th of August, 1732, that Copies of the said Rules and Orders are lodged with the Commissioners of his Majesty's Navy at Chatham, Portsmouth, and Plymouth, as also with the Clerks of the Cheque at Deptford and Woolwich, and the Naval Officers at Harwich, Deal, and Kinsale; where they may be informed of all Particulars which entitle such Widows to the Benefit of the said Charity, and receive the proper Certificates for that Purpose: But such Widows as live at too great a Distance from the Places above mentioned, may apply by Letter to Thomas Corbett, Esq, at the Admiralty Office, who will send them all necessary Information. And the Court of Assistants for Management of the said Charity do hereby give Notice, that they will meet at the Admiralty Office on Tuesday the 9th of September, at Eight of the Clock in the Morning, to receive the Claims of such Widows, as shall be qualified according to the said Rules and Orders.
